RMIA links with Security Analysis & Risk Management Association

The Risk Management Institution of Australasia Ltd (RMIA) and the US-based Security Analysis & Risk Management Association (SARMA) have entered into a memorandum of understanding, establishing an international partnership supporting the security analysis and risk management profession.

The agreement is based on the desire for collaboration and reciprocity between the organisations and expresses the intent of each organisation to give each other's members additional information-sharing opportunities and participation in functions, seminars and projects of the other. Joint working groups may be established to pursue specific research, projects and initiatives.

RMIA members can now access SARMApedia, a collaborative website that focuses on the methodologies, players and language of security risk management.

RMIA President Grant Whitehorn said SARMA sought to link with RMIA because the association was impressed with the work RMIA had done to develop the Security Risk Management Body of Knowledge (SRMBOK). SRMBOK integrates knowledge, competency, methodologies and applications across the risk management discipline.

Future projects on which SARMA and RMIA may cooperate could include promoting risk management standards to a broader professional audience and contributing to the ongoing development of international standards for the profession. "Another important area of cooperation will be creating educational and training materials to ensure the profession has a shared common base of knowledge to sustain itself well into the future," Mr Whitehorn said.
